



Is right-click safe?

The beauty of the solution is that there IS NO SOFTWARE INSTALLED! All the software is already in Microsoft's Internet Explorer web browser. By adding a "MenuExt" (menu extension) entry to the registry settings for a given user's Internet Explorer, we can get extra right-click entries to show up. Each right-click entry goes to a particular web page on our wordsniffer.com server, which in turn relays the lookup request to the WordSniffer server. As you can see, it's totally safe and fits within the security model of Microsoft.

To further emphasize, it's **ALL** in the registry. No software is installed on your system. It's all done within Internet Explorer itself.

What is the .REG file? What DOES the .REG file do?

The ".reg" file is a "registry file". It adds entries to the Windows registry which controls many aspect of the operating system and the applications. In our case, it modifies the "context menu" (ie, the right-click menu) in Internet Explorer to add TurboDictionary lookup choices for the various language pairs. It will not interfere with any other application: only with Internet Explorer in the manner that I just described. The files are very small (only a couple of K), which is totally negligible. Our .reg file is quite safe.

How does the Right Click Work?

The Right-click works as described above. Since it only adds right-click options to Internet Explorer, it doesn't interact with any other programs at all. We've never seen any problems with this, but we do recommend using the latest major version of IE namely 6.x).

Can I install it again?

Absolutely! You can reinstall this again and again, or install it on a different Windows computer. Feel free!

Will it pick up new dictionaries as they become available?

Yes, it will. But it will not pick up new language pairs (like English-to-German). To get those, you'll need to go back to this page and perform the download and installation steps again.

I get a *"sorry, you have exceeded your free usage quota"* message.

This means that you've exceeded your free usage quota for TurboDictionary. This is currently set to 5 searches per 12 hours. You must wait a while until one or more of your searches goes past 12 hours of age, before you can search again.
